## **Program Learn and Play:**

Počet dětí navštěvujících kurzy Learn and Play je maximálně 8, což umožňuje lektorovi pracovat s dětmi na osobnější bázi a být schopen zhodnotiť a věnovat se jejich konkrétním potřebám. Lekce se zaměřují na komunikaci a tvorbu sebedůvěry, ale v pozdějším věku zároveň i na schopnost čtení a psaní. Menší počet dětí ve skupince umožňuje učiteli vést děti k tomu, aby využívaly svých znalostí v nenucené a zábavné atmosféře. Lekce jsou složeny především z her, říkanek, písniček tak, aby si děti co nejvíce zapamatovaly slovní zásobu a osvojily si jednoduchá slovní spojení a věty.
