### **Program English Time:**

Děti jsou do lekce angličtiny vtahovány hrami, soutěžemi ve dvojicích, v týmech i samostatnou prací. Postupně se seznamují i s psaným jazykem. I show a card and the one who says it first gets to choose a box from the grid(i.e. A1, D4, C2). The boxes either have money, a swap, or typhoon. If they get the typhoon, they lose all their money. If they get a swap, they have to swap their money with another player. The winner is the one with the most money at the end of the game.</p> <p><b>Boggle:</b> I write 16 random letters in a 4x4 grid and the students are split into two teams. The goal of the game is to write as many english words as you can ,with the letters from the grid, in 3 minutes. However they can only use each letter in the grid once per word. If both teams have the same word it gets crossed out. They only score points by writing words that the other team doesn't have. They get one point per word. The team with the most points wins.</p>
